DISCOURSE OF THE SIBERIAN SEPARATISM IN THE CONTEXT OF MODERNIZATION ISSUES.

Part 1. Siberian oblasnytstvo: second part of the XIX – beginning of the XX centuries

Abstract. Questions of ideological and organizational background of separatist tendencies of Siberia during the second part of the XIX – beginning of the XX in the form of oblasnytstvo (movement for autonomy or some form of independent status of Siberia as oblast) are analized. There are under discussion prerequisites of oblasnyts tvo as a trend, provoked by colonial geographical, political, socio-economic status of Siberia within Russia; peculiarities of development of oblasnytstvo as movement, oriented at modernization processes in krai. The article is dealt with revealing political positions of the leaders of oblasnytstvo (G.Potanin, M.Yadrintsev, A.Shchapov), their views upon Siberia as a territory with specific features (in geographical, historical, ethnographical, and psychological dimensions) as a platform for independent development. There are under discussion analyses of the process of institutionalization of oblasnytstno movement during the revolutions of 1905-1907 and 1917 years, activity of oblasnytstvo movement representative organs, tendencies of their official registration and motives of decline during the civil war in Russia.

DISCOURSE OF THE SIBERIAN SEPARATISM IN THE CONTEXT OF MODERNIZATION ISSUES.

Part 2. Tendencies of separatism of contemporary Siberia: from soviet to post-soviet times

Abstract. It is analysed separatist movement in contemporary Siberia as a phenomenon, closely associated with traditions of oblasnytstvo (movement for autonomy or some form of independent status of Siberia as oblast) of the second part of the XIX – beginning of the XX centuries as well as of manifestation of separatism in krai under soviet times. Among basic problems of discussion are background of separatism, provoked by exploitation of material and human resources of Siberia, by tough subordination of the region to the interests of centre without accounting the needs of the territory. Author discusses ideological and organizational foundations of contemporary tendencies of separatism in Siberia, accentuates the need of modernization of krai, prognoses its political perspectives according to the course of Moscow towards region. It is noted that in practice the modernization course of Siberia is only possible under consolidation of the local population based on the Siberian

identity, increased influence of local communities on the redistribution of the Siberian natural resources in the primary interests of the region and Siberian population.

TO THE QUESTION OF NATIONAL TENDENCIES OF POLITICAL REBIRTH OF UKRAINE DURING THE PERIOD OF PEREBUDOVA (RECONSTRUCTION)

Abstract. Questions, dealt with national tendencies of social and political processes in Ukraine during the period of reconstruction, are discussed. Authoress analyzes prerequisites of reconstruction processes, provoked by acute economic problems, shows the tendency of evolution of economic protesting movement into social and national ones. Among social actors, which motivated development of national tendencies of political rebirth in Ukraine, - activity of ecological, cultural, social societies. A special attention is given to such social and political organizations, as Ukrainian Helsinki Union, Society of Ukrainian language, People's Movement (Ruh) of Ukraine for reconstruction. It is shown ideological platform of national-democratic and conservative (communist) forces. Authoress reveals contradictive aspects of national and political rebirth of society, dealt with forming of national (Ukrainian) historical, mental, linguistic valuable orientations as well as with traditional «international» platform of unification of society under the stage of struggle for independence. It is revealed also factors, which hampered possibility of getting unity of civilians of Ukraine as political (civil) nation.

Abstract. Activity of Ivan Krypiakevych as a famous Ukrainian historian and public doer in the "Regional Committee of protection of military graves" in Galicia during the 1921-1926 years was examined. There is given analyses of prerequisites and the process of establishing Committee on protection the military graves, realization of the actions of the noted organization on commemoration the honor of fallen heros of Ukraine. Significant role of Ivan Krypiakevych and his contribution to protection and preservation of military graves and cemeteries of the period of the First World War and the Ukrainian-Polish War are discussed. It is enlightened exploratory work of Ivan Krypyakevych: expeditions, activities in collection of donations from the Ukrainian people, printing of necessary materials, cooperation with the Stauropegic Printing House in Lviv where there were published the Instructions for regional committees

UKRAINIAN QUESTION: EVOLUTION OF THINKING OF S.YEFREMOV

RELIGIOUS INFLUENCE OVER SOCIAL IDEOLOGY AND PHILANTROPY IN UNDERRUSSIAN UKRAINE

Abstract. The article deals with some historical aspects of Ukrainian society, state and Orthodox Church. It is based that since Kievan Rus Orthodox Church had become ideological, cultural, spiritual foundation of Ukrainian people: under hard historical times it was asylum not only for unfortunate representatives of society, but for the culture and inner world of Ukrainians on the whole. Religion had become at the same time a motive force for philanthropy as a norm of Christian ethics. It is shown, that religious charity had acquired a special role during the XIX century, when Ukrainians had lost their statehood, were subordinated to Russian empire, and the Church very often represented itself as ideological supplement of imperial policy. It is analyzed activity of some church doers, who were able to preserve spiritual foundations of the previous generations of Ukrainian priesthood and thus influenced originality of Ukrainian nation. Concrete examples of philanthropy – building of churches, schools, hospitals, shelters – of religious doers and prominent businessmen and entrepreneurs (representatives of the Tereshchenko, Kharitonenko, Sukhanov families) are discussed.

THE ROLE OF ZEMSTVO(S) IN THE SPHERE OF HEALTH PROTECTION OF THE POPULATION OF UKRAINIAN PROVINCES IN THE LAST QUARTER OF THE 19TH CENTURY

Abstract. The questions of activity of Zemstvo(s) (as an elective district councils in Russian Empire) in the sphere of health protection of the population of Ukrainian provinces under the liberal reforms of the epoch of Emperor Olexander II during the 1860-1870th years are discussed. Article is dealt with analyses of achievements and failures of Zemstvos in the sphere of health protection as specific and nontraditional (according to the regulatory documents) direction of activity of the noted organs. It is given analyses of activity of six Zemvos (these are Katerinoslav, Poltava, Tavriia,

PRINCIPLES OF ORGANIZATION AND REALIZATION OF LAW SAFEGUARDING ACTIVITIES IN THE STATES OF TURKS UNDER EARLY PERIOD OF MIDDLE AGES

Abstract. Main principles of organization of the system of state power and law safeguarding activity in ancient Turk states of Eurasia are studied. It is revealed, that according to specific features of nomad statehood of Turks during the early period of Middle Ages law safeguarding and military activities within society were united organizationally and inter-conditioned one another. So far economic policy of Turks leaders – Kahans and their top administrators - was focused on providing tribes fellows

by pastures and water resources by the means of war, all aspects of social and public life of ancient Turk states were militarized. This tendency was dealt also with law safeguarding activity, which had to guarantee loyalty of society members to the state and its policy, efficiency of state institutions, the authority of the state and its administration. With due regard to the factor of prevailing role of wars for ensuring tribes and state of ancient Turks by necessary resources, law safeguarding activity was also oriented at organization of the process of mobilization of resources under conditions of war.

UKRAINIAN STATE PROCESSES DURING THE SECOND HALF OF THE XVIII CENTURY

(to the question of Cossack military units)

Abstract. The history of Cossak military units on the Ukrainian lands during the second half of XVIII century – after liquidation of Hetmanshchina (as autonomous

Ukrainian Cossak state) and under active offensive of Russian tsarism against rights and liberties of Ukrainian people — is studied. There are under discussion preconditions and character of forming and functioning of Cossak military units — Zadunaiska (Transdanubian) Sich (1775–1828), Bug Cossak army (1785–1817), Katerinoslav Cossak army (1787–1789), Chornomorsk (Black sea) Cossak army(1788–1860) and others, their role within Russian Empire and Ukrainian society. It is asserted, that Cossack military units served as reliable instrument of the Russian military forces under the conditions of wars against Osman Empire; they had to become also in the noted aspect an instrument of providing Russian imperialism and chauvinism. MILITARY MERCENARIES OF THE BYZANTINE EMPIRE: TRADITIONS AND ROLE OF KIEVAN RUS

Abstract. The problems of military mercenaries in the Byzantine Empire as an essential phenomenon of the history of medieval ages are discussed. The article is oriented at elucidating special conditions of forming Byzantine army during the X-XI centuries by the way of hiring warriors. Factors of stability of military contingent of Byzantine Empire according to the functional, material, juridical incentives of mercenaries are revealed. With due regard to the complex of published historical sources and scientific heritage of Ukrainian and foreign researchers it is done analyses of the traditions of service within Byzantine army of the mercenaries from Kievan Rus. Among main aspects of discussion in this respect are chronology of engagement of the warriors from Kyiv state to Byzantine army, peculiarities of their status within Byzantine state. TEACHERS AS AN INSTRUMENT OF ANTI-RELIGION PROPAGANDA IN RURAL SCHOOLS DURING THE 1920-1930th YEARS (after the example of Chernihiv region)

Abstract. Main directions and methods of anti-religious policy of the Soviet administration in the rural school of the Chernihiv region during the 1920-1930th years under authoritarian communist regime are discussed. The article is dealt with revealing organizational and institutional foundations of realization communist anti-religious policy in the noted region; with conditions, under which teachers became first-hand providers of the policy of the Bolshevik power. The role of rural teachers in realization anti-religious atheist propaganda as well as difficulties which rural specialists had to overcome are analyzed. It is stated, that extremely active ideological policy of the Bolshevik regime, repressions against dissidents obliged rural teachers to accept the position of atheists and activists in anti-religious sphere. However even under severe control of the communist administration over the society there were facts of protesting acts of rural teachers against anti-religious pressing, dealt with aspiration to preserve their right on liberty of conscious or even to take holy orders.

Abstract.
